



Guidelines for Submitting a video/audio application

- Your video application must be in English and under 10 minutes long
- Has to respond to **all** of the application questions included below — You should answer each question in the order they appear, stating the number of the question before you begin your answer
- Don't waste time on video production, we will only mark the application based on the content you provide, rather than the visuals/quality of the video
- Make sure the audio is clear, ideally with no background noise. We need to hear your words!
- Ideally, you would upload your video to YouTube as “unlisted” or “private” – this way you can enable closed captions to create subtitles automatically. Alternatively, you can send us your video/audio submission using [WeTransfer.com](https://www.wetransfer.com) to goodpush@skateistan.org
- Along with your video/audio submission, please send us the links to your organization's website and/or social media channels, as well as links to any media coverage (articles, photos, videos) about your organization/project. (If available, we highly encourage you to send links to photos/videos as it helps our judging panel to get a better understanding of your organization and the work that you do.)
- **In summary, to apply via video/audio submission, please email goodpush@skateistan.org with the link to your video/audio piece, along with the relevant links to your website/social media and any media coverage you wish to share.**

(For example, do you have access to skateboarding equipment/facilities? Are you in a rural/urban area? What is the local skate scene like?)
