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1. TRAVELING IN BORDEAUX

Download the "TBM Mobilités" app (highly recommended):

1 ticket = 1 hour (same ticket usable for one hour on all transportation)
1 ticket = 1.90€ on the "TMB" app; 2.10€ purchased at the terminal.

Tickets are cheaper on the app: you need internet access on your phone to buy them, and to scan them in the bus or the tramway.

Without the app, buy your ticket at the station terminal, in the tramway tickets are not sold onboard. For buses, tickets can be purchased from the driver if needed.

Buses and tramway stations have accessible ramps.

City bikes (electric and regular) are available throughout the city: 1€ for a regular bike or 2€ for an electric bike for the first 30 minutes, then 0.10€/minute. You can enter your information directly at the bike station terminal to use a bike.

Bordeaux is a small town and easy to navigate skating from one spot to another.











Location of Accommodation:

Residhotel Galerie Tatry 174 Cours du Médoc 33300 Bordeaux


Where to book? "Residhotel Galerie Tatry" on the website "Booking.com". The prices are more interesting on this plateform:

- Studio (2 adults): 1 double bed or 2 single beds: 250€ for 3 nights / 321€ for 4 nights
- 1-Bedroom Apartment (3 or 4 adults): 1 double bed or 2 single beds, 1 sofa bed (2 places): 334€ for 3 nights / 388€ for 4 nights

Each studio includes a **bathroom** with towels and hair-dryer, a **kitchen** with a fridge, an oven etc.

Breakfast is not included in the price.

Check in starts at 2 pm until 10:30pm. Check out at 11 am.













The team will stay at this hotel, but you are free to choose another option if you prefer.

The dates: The festival runs from the 17th (thursday) to the evening of the 20th (sunday).

The team is booked from the 16th (wednesday) to the 21st (monday), but you can choose what fits best for you.

If you're coming solo and want to share a room, reach out! We know some awesome girls and queer skaters looking to do the same. It's a great chance to save money and meet new friends.




Route from the airport to the Residhotel Galerie Tatry at "Cours du Medoc":

Option 1 (highly recommanded): The journey takes about 1 hour and costs between €1.90 and €2.10 (a reminder that tickets purchased on the TBM app are cheaper).

From the airport, take **Tramway A** towards "La Gardette" or "Floirac Dravemont" and ride for about 40 minutes until you reach "Porte de Bourgogne."

There, switch to **Tramway C** towards "Gare de Blanquefort" and ride for 15 minutes until you reach "Grand Parc." Get off and cross the road, the hotel will be on your right.













Option 2 (not recommended: more expensive and takes more time), airport/hotel. You can take the "Navette" shuttle bus from the airport to "La Gare Saint-Jean" (train station) for €10, which takes about 1 hour.

From there, buy a TBM ticket and take Tramway C towards "Gare de Blanquefort" for 25 minutes, getting off at "Grand Parc." This option costs around €12 in total and takes 1.5 hours.

Route from the train and bus station "La Gare Saint-Jean":

The journey takes about 25 minutes and costs between €1.90 and €2.10 (a reminder tickets purchased on the TBM app are cheaper).

If you arrive by train, buy a TBM ticket, take **Tramway C** towards "Gare de Blanquefort," and ride for 25 minutes until you reach "Grand Parc." Get off and cross the road, the hotel will be on your right.

If you arrive by bus, the tram station is right in front of you, and the route is the same.














3. PRACTICAL INFO

Closest Supermarket from the hotel:

Auchan, 42-50 Avenue Emile Counord, 33300 Bordeaux, open 8:30am to 8pm

Where and when is the festival happening? 17 - 20 October

At Cour Mably, 3 Rue Mably, 33000 Bordeaux, France.

From the "Quinconces" tram stop, walk down Cours du 30 Juillet, then turn right onto Rue Mably to reach Cours Mably in about 5 minutes, to the large archway entrance.

Contemporary museum: CAPC, 7 Rue Ferrere, 33000 Bordeaux, open 11am - 6pm. 8€ entrance access to all exhibitions, 6€ when no exhibition in the nave, and for students under the age of 26: 2€ (single rate).

Science Museum: Cap Sciences, Hangar 20, Quai de Bacalan, 33300 Bordeaux, open 2pm - 6/7pm. 10€ entrance fee.

Wine Museum: La Cité du Vin, 134 Quai de Bacalan, 33300 Bordeaux, open 10am - 7pm. 20-25€ entrance fee.

6. COMMUNITYGUIDELINES: A SAFER SPACE

We prioritize creating a welcoming, hate-free space where all participants feel safe, respected, and included to enjoy the festival.

Inclusivity and Respect: All participants are welcome, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, identity, race, body size, physical appearance, ethnicity, ability, or background.

We prioritize respect for boundaries, consent, and open communication to create an inclusive and safe space for everyone.

Code of Conduct: Non-discriminatory language, inclusive participation, and respectful communication are required.

Respectful Communication requires avoiding offensive jokes or comments, including those related to gender, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, mental health, disabilities, religion, or any other identity, to prevent stigma and harm.











6. COMMUNITYGUIDELINES: A SAFER SPACE

Safety Measures: The **"Floor angels"** are designated safe space keepers. Trained stewards who the attendees may approach if they feel unsafe or witness unsafe behaviour.

Enforcement: Violations lead to open conversations, to warnings, or removal, with guidelines continuously updated based on feedback.

All individuals are seen as valuable members of this community, there is no need to measure your own or someone else's worth in terms of how they express themselves.

Environmental Responsibility: Attendees must keep the festival space clean and respect the environment.
